## **APPENDIX A – applies during response to COVID 19 pandemic and the phased wider opening of schools.**

### **Aim**

To provide clear amendments to the school behaviour policy, in line with government guidance issued during the Covid 19 pandemic, for staff, parents and pupils so that all staff and pupils are at minimum risk of infection.

### **Behaviour expectations:**

- Staff must model social distancing for children and expect children to follow social distancing guidance in an age appropriate way. Staff will offer regular reminders and reasoning about why social distancing is required.
- Social distancing must be followed on arriving and departing school and when moving around the school site under direction of a member of staff. Children will not be allowed free movement around the school.
- Staff are to teach children about safe ways to cough and sneeze “Catch It, Kill it, Bin it” and use of the crook of the elbow to catch an unexpected cough or sneeze, and staff must model this themselves. Children and staff must not cough or sneeze near others and must immediately wash their hands.
- Staff are to teach children how to wash their hands effectively and model this themselves. Children will be expected to wash their hands when directed to by a member of staff as well as older children identifying for themselves times when they need to wash their hands.
- Children will be expected to remain seated in designated workspaces (or carpet spaces) when in class and not wander freely around the classroom. All equipment will be supplied to their allocated work station.
- Children must not share equipment or bring in unrequested items from home.
- Children must refrain from putting items in their mouths.
- Children must be able to follow verbal instructions given by a member of staff.

The school will communicate these expectations as part of the wider opening plan and staff will work closely with parents to support them in helping their children comply with these new rules. Staff will model and teach safety guidance to the children so they understand the reasons for the new rules. Staff will continue to focus on positive reinforcement of these rules. Non-compliance with these safety rules will put staff and children at significant risk. Therefore, if despite support and modelling, children are not able to comply with the new rules then under current safety guidance it will be unsafe to have these children in school.
