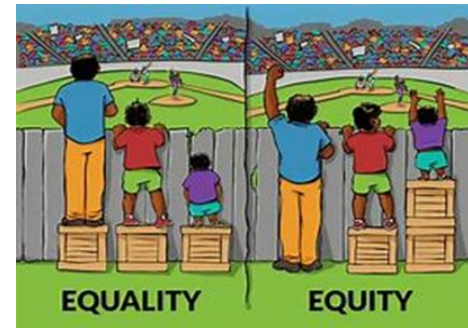

School Improvement Curriculum Priority

Improve writing through:

- More independence and writing choice
- Improve application of accurate Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar
- Change to Read, Write, Inc lessons
- Ensuring high standards of presentation and handwriting (joined from Y2 onwards)

Communication

Parent Pay – important school communication from the office and used to book school meals, wrap around child care and pay for trips

Email – More official and formal communications

Class Dojo – instant and informal (or emergency) messaging & sharing of photographs

Website- policies, diary dates, curriculum information, useful resources/links

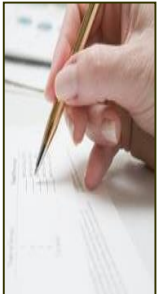
Office Telephone – reporting absence, passing on messages, requesting information/support

Financial support

- Second hand uniform and wellie swaps
- Check entitlement to Free School Meals (Rec-Y2) KS2 if in receipt of certain benefits – check with office.
- Eligible for Pupil Premium – additional funding for school to support children's learning.
- Financial support for the school from FOBS fundraising

Some other things you need to know...

- Named, refillable water bottle in school each day
- Fruit or vegetable snack (EYFS & KS1 provided)- Nut free school (Whole School Food Policy)
- Friday celebration assembly – please share successes and achievements
- Wear school PE kit on PE Days
- Reading – essential skill to access learning and essential to practice as part of homework expectation
- Attendance – Holidays in term time are not authorised because this result in missed learning (<90% =persistent absentee)
- School day starts at 8:45am – don't let your child miss valuable learning time by being late
- Suitable outdoor clothing (wellies/coats/sunhats)
